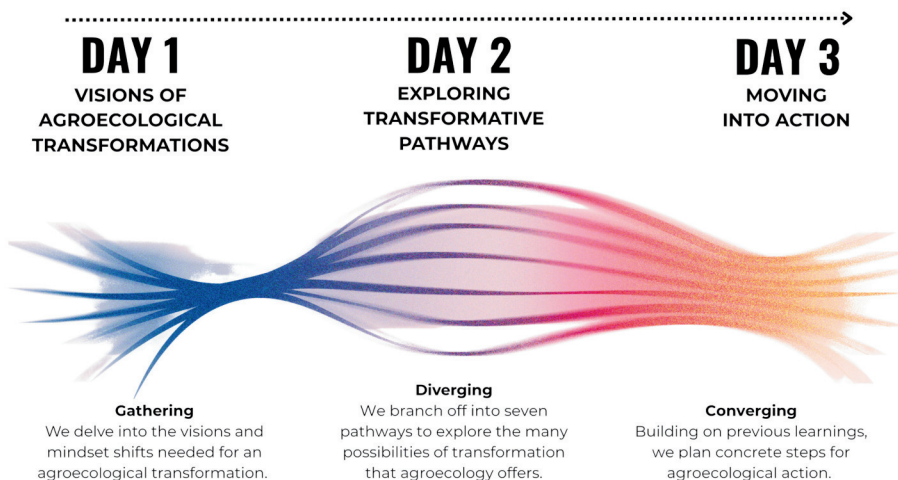
A “JOMO” PROGRAMME

To strengthen their impact, visions should be experienced rather than simply discussed. Our intention in this workshop is to give the participants an opportunity to experience their own ability to envision a desired future state relevant to agroecological transformation.
